rejoice. When we started the SMART program back in October 2012, little did we know that we would still be going strong a decade down the line. Those who

interventions have reached a similar milestone. Hence, it gives us at Tech Mahindra Foundation an immense sense of satisfaction that we have successfully supported nearly 150,000 youngsters from the lower socioeconomic strata to become valuable contributors to their household incomes by taking up jobs in the formal sector. We began with the simple goal of helping youth improve their employment prospects by enhancing their employability, and we have done exactly that over the last ten years.

If we have been able to achieve this milestone, we have all our NGO partners to thank for it - too many to list here, but each of them invaluable. An early decision we took was to reach out to relatively smaller organizations embedded within low-income urban communities and work closely with them in implementing the program. In the process, several of these organizations have gone on to become leading players in the skill development space, hence multiplying our

imprint in this domain manifold. Once the SMART center model had reached a degree of maturity, we decided to up the ante in the skilling space by setting up and running the SMART Academies which are now providing cutting edge

training in the essential sectors of Healthcare, Digital Technologies and Logistics. What has also worked well for us is the belief that employability enhancement is as much about the core competencies of communication, workplace readiness and technology familiarisation, as it is about imparting technical or occupational skills. Hence, nearly 70% of what a student learns at a SMART centre or Academy focuses on the foundational skills that are critical to succeeding at the workplace.

One challenge that has spurred us on through the years is to stay a step ahead of the constantly evolving requirements of the job market on the one hand, and the rising aspirations of the urban youth on the other. The SMART program has kept its pulse on both the demand and supply sides and has adapted to their changing requirements. We have regularly introduced new courses and innovative approaches, while our students have made us proud by demonstrating the ambition to pursue higher goals for themselves. Advances made in technology have permeated the world of work over the last decade,

even as the reversals of the pandemic have taught us lessons in resilience and empathy like never before. In keeping with these trends, learning modules on

Mental Wellbeing and Digital Literacy have found their way into the SMART curriculum – developed and regularly revised by the Learning & Development team at TMF.

As we celebrate the ten-year landmark, we know we have many mountains to climb in the journey ahead. The senior management team of TMF recently converged in Hyderabad where, among other things, we deliberated upon the future of SMART. We are well aware that the landscape ahead may be nothing like what we have encountered earlier, and we are gearing ourselves to embrace the future with the same fortitude, resilience, and the spirit of whatever it takes as we have done over the past decade.

In SMART, communities remain at the core, since the focus is always to expand

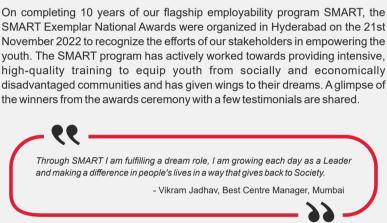
